

Cookers



What are they used for?

Cookers are used to dissolve pills, powdered or solid drugs, with sterile water, to create a liquid that can be injected.

Practice:

Cookers should be heated for a minimum of 15 seconds to kill as much bacteria as possible.

How they are used:

Place drugs and sterile water into a Spoon or Stericup and cook using a heat source such as a lighter.

Risks:

- Cookers should never be shared. HIV and Hep C can be spread if you share cookers.
- A new clean cooker should be used each time you inject so that you don't get an infection.
